## Refugees on the labour market

Foreign-born establishment in the labour market is a key part of the integration, and is important both from a societal perspective and from an individual perspective. Refugees who settle in Sweden is a group of foreign-born who often have no connection to the labour market when they immigrate. In this study, we follow the refugees received in different years and see how long it takes before a proportion of the group work in the Swedish labour market.

Statistics Sweden has register information on reason for immigration and time for immigration. Register based labour statistics classify workers, mainly based on data from the Swedish tax agency.

The proportion working among the group of refugees increase with the time in Sweden. The first two years, most of the refugees spend in some sort of education or introduction program. Hence, the proportion working is low the first years. The increase in the proportion working is more powerful after the first years. When comparing groups of refugees with different immigration years, one can see that the pattern of the development in the percentage working is equal. However, the level between groups with different







## Percent working among refugees by year after immigration, different immigration years.




## Percent working among refugees by year after immigration and sex. Immigration year 2000.
